

Hello friends and readers, today we're going to meet Mr. Ravikant Balakrishna Sangurde who has an doctorate in business administration and is a professor at S. K. Somaiya college of arts, science and commerce.

You are looked up my many students. So how would describe your student years and to whom you grew look up to?

--> Bhagat Singh, Lokmanya Balgangadhar Tilak, and Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj, were the ones who inspired me as a student because they were the idols for me. They gave me an important learning no matter what happens the nation always come first. They instilled in me the importance of nationalism and the will to never give up no matter what curveballs life throws at you. I also try to imitate the same by putting our nation first in all my endaveours. Our great Shivaji Maharaj, when he was a child, he and his friends had taken a vow to protect the Swarajya and for that they fought many battles with Mughals. Shivaji Maharaj gave me a teaching even though you are less in number, you can fight like a lion. I also greatly admired Lokmanya Tilak. He proudly says, "Swaraj is my birthright, and I shall have it!" He taught me that you can achieve anything if you have the fire to work for it. So, this way, one must learn from these great people.

When I was in college I joined the National Cadet Corps so that I could join the Army and serve my nation, which is why I even appeared for my CDS Exams, but unfortunately I could not clear that, however life had something else in store for me which I am grateful for, because even as a professor I am getting to serve the nation and do something meaningful. I was national level sportsman and represented University of Mumbai at All India Inter University Road Race competition held at Ahmdabad University in December 1995. I played football for Mumbai First Division football team 'Jai Ambe Football Club (JAFC). I took loan for studies from one Coperative Credit society and completed my M.Com from Mumbai University and MBA in HR from Symbiosis Centre for Distance Learning. Later on i cleared my NET exams twice one in commerce subject and another in Managemet subject and also cleared my SET exam in commerce to become lecturer. as a student of commerce I also completed my PhD in Bhagavad Gita and Management. I completed my basic and advance Mountaineering course from Atal Bihari Institute of Mountaineering and Allied sport at Manali, Himachael Pradesh. On spiritual front I completed Bhakti-shastri and Bhakti-vaibhav course from Bhakti Vedanta Academy for Culture and Education (BACE) ISKCON-Chowpatty, Mumbai.

Our Mumbai University is now around 50 years old. How do you think it is different from other universities to survive for so long?

--> The University of Mumbai, as you rightly said has been around for many years; in fact, it was established during the British Rule in India. Many eminent personalities such as Mohandas Gandhi, Sir Ram Manohar Mishra, Lokmanya Tilak, Lal Krishna Advani, Sir C.M. Ranchodlal, Muhammed Ali Jinnah, Aditi Govitrikar, John Abraham, Sonakshi Sinha and others such as Kashinath Telang, Ramkrishna Bandarkar have been the Vice-Chancellors of this University. The important aspect is that Mumbai University is the only university which offers all kinds of courses. With its Campuses spread all across Maharashtra, offering a variety of courses from UG to PG, it has more than 700 colleges affiliated to it and 56 departments looking after the various courses, plus it recently got an A++ grade in the NAAC Accreditation, their highest ranking and the list of notable alumni from the University is endless,

so considering all these reasons one can surely say that it is indeed a great university which I am sure will hold on to its prestige in the future as well. Mumbai university has nicely expanded itself. If you look at the history of human necessity, you'll find out the very reputate names came from our university. In future also, Mumbai University will survive and cherished by many.

Do you think with the advent of all these new technologies where student can learn from anywhere, the essence of Guru-shishya parampara is fading?

--> We cannot generalize this question.

--> We cannot generalize this question. It solely depends on every student and every teacher. The invent of technology has given ample opportunity for you to learn from anywhere While I agree with the question you have asked, as a teacher I also believe in and am aware of the impact I have on my student's and while you have students taking help of the new resources that are available to them due to the emergence of technology nothing can replace the role of a teacher in their (students) lives.



I believe technology can never replace the personal touch, or the one-on-one approach of the teacher, because teaching is a two-way process, where both teachers and their pupils learn from each other. Teachers not only teach students but help them become better versions of themselves. Teachers are also like our second parents because as students we do spend a good amount of time in their shadows everyday in various educational institutions, be it schools or colleges and that is what makes it so special. More than a teacher, he is a mentor, a guide, a torch bearer. Teacher not only teaches you subjects but did he or she imbibes good qualities in you. Based on what I just said you have Ram and his guru Vasistha along with Krishna and his guru Sandipani as fine examples of how teachers can change your lives.

The relation between teacher and student will never end. It will be there in some way or the other.

You have been vocal about adding Spiritual Quotient to student life. How do you think a normal student can achieve that?

--> This is the age of competition. Success and Failure are two sides of the same coin is something one must understand. With competition amongst peers is on the rise everybody is running behind success; everybody wants to become successful and while it's good I would also like to say that it cannot be the ultimate goal of one's life.

There is a very famous incident in Mahabharata where Krishna says Arjuna, "This happiness and sadness are part and parcel of the life. They are the two extremes of the same line. They are like seasons. It comes and goes. But the one with a steady mind is unbothered of such changes. He works on his life. So, we must teach our students that failures are also part of the life. The one who searches for the pearl dives into the ocean hundred times and in that he has a probability of getting a pearl. Success is not a destination. It is a journey, and, in that journey, one may fail but he must not leave his journey. There is also a very interesting incident I would like to quote.

Thomas Edison, the inventor of bulb has gone through this journey. He experimented 10,000 time and he failed in all of them. He tried it one more time and then he succeeded. So, the bulb we are seeing now is the 10,001st experiment of him. When a reporter asked, "What about those mistakes in 10,000 times?" So, he said my dear friend, "Those were not my mistake. Those were my steppingstone to success, now I know how this bulb will not work 12999 time"

Failure is what nobody teaches us to deal with. Even if we fail, we must never give up and keep trying till we succeed. There are many people out there who invented things which we use today in our daily lives. It took them years of hard work and perseverance to create what they eventually did. We must learn from our mistakes and therefore I believe we need spiritual knowledge because it tells us about life's reality, about ourselves and teaches us to be happy and keep going no matter what even during the darkest of times. It is the need of the hour. All around us we can see people are frustrated and stressed. The main reason behind that is lack of spiritual knowledge. Considering all this I do believe that Spiritual Knowledge is very important. It adds some meaning to you great life.

What message would you like to give our readers through this magazine?

--> "Karmanye Vadhikaraste, Ma Phaleshu Kadachana, Ma

Karmaphalaheturbhurma, Te Sangostvakarmani." This famous Shloka from the Bhagwad Gita tells us that we must keep on performing our duties without expecting for any reward in return, leading a selfless life – this is what it is all about. I came from a poor household where I was the youngest of all my siblings, and my mother, in order to make ends meet worked as a house help and all this made me want to work hard. So, I enrolled myself in a Municipality School, started working and to finish my Master's degree I had to take a loan from the bank, following which I cleared my NET-CET exam and did my Ph.D.

Currently I am a professor in Somaiya College and the Dean of Faculty of Commerce in Mumbai University. I am also the director of the Centre of Hindu studies. I would like to add,

Don't run after success. If you work hard success will surely come to you. Even when you are studying, study like never before. Create your own path, work had and never give up. 2)Spencer:




3)Victoria and Abdul:

A NEW SUN SHINES

Governor Bhagat Singh Koshyari recently appointed Dr Ajay Bhamare as in-charge Pro-VC of the University of Mumbai. The appointment comes after the Vice-Chancellor (VC) of Shivaji University, Kolhapur Dr Digambar Tukaram Shirke was appointed as interim VC of the Mumbai University. Even as the search for a new full-time VC has just begun, Bhamare Sir took charge as Pro-VC on Monday.

Bhamare Sir was the principal of Ramanand Arya DAV College in Bhandup. They has served in several important positions at Mumbai University. He was also chairman of the Board of Studies, dean of its faculty of Commerce and Management and a member of the Senate, Management Council and Academic Council of the university. He was also designated assessor of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and a member of the Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), Maharashtra.

In their capacity as Chairman of the Board of Studies, Bhamare Sir was known to have initiated an ambitious programme to revise and upgrade the commerce and business management syllabi of the Mumbai University - which has over 800 affiliated colleges - to align them with the changing needs of business and industry.


On asking about the future endeavours they said, "It is to utilise my decades of experience in higher education to contribute to the upgradation of this sacrosanct institute along with other stakeholders. The focus will be on implementing the National Education Policy (NEP). Moreover in the post-COVID era, the academic calendar and teaching-learning and evaluation of the university are getting restored to normality."

He also talked about the challenges that he thinks he will be facing during his tenure. He said, "I am looking forward to the completion of all pending issues. Of course, there are many challenges before me such as holding elections of all bodies and authorities ie the senate, management and academic council, board of studies, etc. There is also implementation of Academic Bank of Credit (ABC). The focus will also be on revision and upgradation of the curriculum as per NEP under the guidance of the VC. We are also exploring tie-ups with many US universities. We are promoting the newly established Sindhudurg sub campus through support from the government of Maharashtra for tourism-related courses."









Blood Donation at M.L. Dahanukar College




